



La Paloma Group Home



La Paloma has some exciting events happening!

LOVARC has purchased the empty lot right next door to La Paloma in May 2021and has plans to develop an outdoor space for the residents.

While interviewing *Bethany Mattis the Director and Manager of La Paloma* some plans she has in mind are to create a parking lot for staff and van parking that will have easier wheel-chair access for our residents.. Some outdoor activities that are also in mind are vegetable gardens, flower beds and a shaded picnic area, that gives a nice family visiting area where residents can enjoy some time with family and friends. BIG NEWS FOR LOVARC!

We sold our D ST location after 27 years!

123 North D Street location was sold May 10th, 2022.

LOVARC was originally at this location for 27 years until we moved to our newest location on North I Street. The D Street location was originally a home with five bedrooms that were converted into offices and it had a front and back wheelchair ramp.

After selling the location Co-CEO's Elen and Shelly both decided to bring the LOVARC sign that was on the building and it is now placed here in the office and hung up on our wall



LOVARC'S HISTORY

Life Options, Vocational and Resources Center (LOVARC) was originally established by a group of parents in 1964 to assist children with developmental disabilities. The LOVARC acronym originally meant "Lompoc Valley Association for Retarded Children". As schools eventually provided services to this population LOVARC changed it's focus to adults and its name to Lompoc Valley Association for Retarded Citizens. In 1996 with a federal food service contract at Vandenberg Air Force base LOV-ARC's focus shifted to serve people with all disabilities. To avoid the stigma word "retarded", LOVARC's name changed again to "Life Options, Vocational and Resource Center," retaining the LOVARC acronym.
